

Gather a 12-13" long oval planter—about 4– 6" deep. If it doesn't have a liner, you can use a piece of garbage bag cut to fit. Place a few inches of all-purpose potting soil in your container. Next take plants out of their pots and put in place. Fill in around plants with potting soil. Add a decorative holiday pick into the soil, or a ribbon around the container or handles.


